COMMUNITY BACKGROUND

Hononegah Community High School District 207 is located in Rockton, IL, 12 miles north of Rockford, IL. The district has served the communities of Rockton, Roscoe, Shirland and portions of South Beloit since 1923. The district encompasses approximately 109 square miles with a population of approximately 30,000. The community is primarily middle class in nature.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

HCHS is a comprehensive 4-year public high school with a current enrollment of 2037 - 505 seniors. Hononegah Community High School is accredited by the AdvancED Illinois and the State of Illinois. In addition to a comprehensive college preparatory curriculum with extensive offerings in AP and honors courses, a wide range of Career and Technical Education programs are available for students.

SCHOOL YEAR ORGANIZATION

The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The school day is divided into seven periods. The first semester ends on December 21, 2017 and the second semester ends May 24, 2018.

FACULTY

The staff consists of 138 certificated personnel, including 10 nationally board certified teachers. Over 77% of the teaching staff holds a master's degree or higher. The teacher student ratio is 22:1.

GRADING AND CREDIT



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS CLASS OF 2018

46 credits are required for graduation, distributed as detailed below:

- English 8 credits
- <u>Mathematics</u> 6 credits; 2 must be Algebra, 2 must be a course with Geometry content; 1 may be computer programming
- Science 4 credits
- <u>Social Studies</u> 4 credits; 1 must be US Government, 2 must be US History and 1 must be an elective. Successful completion of US Government or AP US Government meets state requirements for the Illinois and US Constitution tests.
- <u>Consumer Education</u> 1 credit
- Health Education 1 credit
- <u>Computer Course</u> 1 credit
- Student Choice 2 credits; art, music, foreign language, or a career and technical education course
- <u>Physical Education</u>- By Illinois state law, PE must be taken every semester of attendance except the semester Health and Driver's Ed are taken. A proficiency waiver exists for juniors and seniors.
